



David A. Hanks is the curator of the Stewart Program for Modern Design in Montreal. He has written extensively on nineteenth- and twentieth-century decorative design, including *The Century of Modern Design*.

Richard H. Driehaus, Chicago businessman, philanthropist, and founder of the Driehaus Museum, is a prominent collector of late nineteenth- and early twentieth-century fine and decorative arts. A seminal artist of the Gilded Age, Louis Comfort Tiffany is the best known and most widely collected figure in late nineteenth- and early twentieth-century American decorative arts. The splendid objects from the Driehaus Collection, installed as the inaugural exhibition of the Richard H. Driehaus Museum, showcase a wide variety of Tiffany's work in an architectural setting of the period.

Newly commissioned photographs highlight the subtle detail and rich coloring of each object, revealing why Tiffany is so revered as a designer. Essays by Richard H. Driehaus and David A. Hanks explore the collector's vision and Tiffany Studios's largely unknown legacy in Chicago.



Richard Aste is curator of European Art at the Brooklyn Museum. He was formerly associate curator of European Art at Museo de Arte de Ponce in Puerto Rico. A collaboration with the Brooklyn Museum, *Behind Closed Doors* explores works of art from life in Spanish colonial America, revealing a privileged class seeking to define its social, economic, and political place in the New World. Drawing on the Brooklyn Museum's renowned collection of Spanish and British colonial art, this book presents magnificent domestic work, focusing on three categories of elite household goods: portraiture, informed by native and European court traditions; luxury objects designed for formal use; and religious objects for private devotion.

The essays, written by leading scholars, provide a dramatically new perspective on the fine and applied arts in the colonies from the late fifteenth through early nineteenth centuries. For a popular audience, it presents a new outlook on Spanish colonial art, showing how art and luxury goods signaled wealth, status, faith, and nobility in a society where class boundaries were more fluid than in Spain.





Becky E. Conekin lectures in European history at Yale University. She has previously taught in Paris, Berlin, and London at the London College of Fashion and is a fellow of the Royal Historical Society. Surrealist artist, muse of Man Ray, photographer, fashion model and *Vogue* war correspondent, Lee Miller defies categorization and has beguiled several generations. This is the first book to focus on her work as a model and fashion photographer, illuminating both her life and the history of fashion for more than 25 years. A sought-after fashion model in 1920s New York, Miller traveled to Paris in 1929 to study with Man Ray, which led her to photography. During World War II she turned to photojournalism, producing some of the war's most memorable images.

Stunning archival photographs, contact sheets, fieldnotes, articles, telegrams and letters illustrate this beautifully designed volume. Conekin has carefully selected those that best reflect the sharp wit, daring modernism and timeless style of their creator.



Jane Garmey is a noted garden writer and contributor to 1stdibs, World of Interiors and The New York Times. Born in England, she is the author of The Writer in the Garden and Great British Cooking: A Well-Kept Secret.

John M. Hall is a well-known garden and interiors photographer based in New York. He has collaborated with many landscape architects and garden writers, including Page Dickey and Edwina von Gal, and with Richard Jenrette on Adventures with Old Houses.

A companion to *Private Gardens of Connecticut* compiled by the same writer/photographer team, *Private Gardens of the Hudson Valley* surveys the majestic landscape that borders the Hudson River, an area rich in history and unique garden designs. This luxurious volume is a collection of twenty-six gardens chosen to give a sense of place and convey the romance of the landscape, and John Hall's photographs give a privileged view of the life within. 





Robert A. M. Stern is the founding partner of Robert A. M. Stern Architects and dean of the School of Architecture at Yale University. He is the principal author of the monumental five-volume history of architecture and urban design in New York City, culminating with New York 2000 (The Monacelli Press, 2006), co-authored with David Fishman and Jacob Tilove.

From the firm of Robert A. M. Stern, the same team that produced the monumental five-volume architectural history of New York, comes the definitive work on the development of the garden suburb, a phenomenon that first emerged in England in the 1830s. The concept still dominates residential architecture today, as the retrofitting of suburbs has become a central issue in urban planning. Emerging strategies to create walkable communities continue to hark back to the original Garden City movement, which offered an ideal lifestyle outside of the city. *Paradise Planned* is the comprehensive, encyclopedic record of this development, a vital contribution to architectural history but also an essential resource in current urban planning.

The culmination of a 10-year research and writing process, the book will be the architectural publishing event of 2013, and an essential resource for guiding the repair of the American townscape.





Steven Heller is the 2011 recipient of the Smithsonian National "Design Mind"
Award. He is the co-chair of the MFA Design/Designers as Author + Entrepreneur program at the School of Visual Arts in New York and the editor and/or co-author of more than 140 books on design and popular culture. He writes The Daily Heller blog and is a columnist for The Atlantic online and the New York Times Book Review.

Mirko Ilić has collaborated with both Milton Glaser and Steven Heller as co-author on multiple books and as a teacher at Cooper Union and the School of Visual Arts. Today typography has jumped off the printed page to stand on its own as branding, sculpture, and even architecture. *Lettering Large* examines this phenomenon through a diverse collection of images collected from a vast range of sources around the world. As technology has made construction and production of monumental letters possible, the demand for their design has grown exponentially. This book is the first to chronicle letters as presences in the urban landscape. 

Karen E. Milbourne is curator at the National Museum of African Art, Smithsonian Institution. Formerly she was associate curator at the Baltimore Museum of Art and assistant professor at the University of Kentucky, and has contributed to African Cosmos: Stellar Arts (The Monacelli Press, 2012).

Accompanying a pioneering exhibition organized by the National Museum of African Art, Smithsonian Institution, *Earth Matters* explores African art throughout history as it relates to African concepts of the earth. Curator and author Dr. Karen E. Milbourne examines comprehensively for the first time how individuals and communities in Africa visually mediate their relationship with the land on which they live, work, and frame their days. One hundred exceptional works of art from the late 18th to 21st centuries are featured, including historic treasures such as the Musée du Quai Branly's exquisite Punu reliquary and a rare Yorube onile figure alongside works by internationally renowned and emerging talents from across the continent, including William Kentridge and Wangechi Mutu.

Françoise Astorg Bollack is the principal of Francoise Bollack Architects, a firm that specializes in preservation and reinvention of historic structures, and a faculty member at the Columbia University School of Architecture, Planning and Preservation.

It is clear that working with historic structures is both more environmentally sustainable and cost effective than new construction—and many believe that the best design occurs at the intersection of old and new. Bollack presents 28 examples gathered in the United States and throughout Europe and the Middle East. Some are well known—Mass MOCA, Market Santa Caterina in Barcelona, Neues Museum in Berlin—and others are almost anonymous. But all demonstrate a unique and appropriate solution to the problem of adapting historic structures to contemporary uses. This survey of contemporary additions to older buildings is an essential addition to the architectural literature.

Retrofitting historic buildings for contemporary use is a vital part of current architectural practice, and a hot topic in architecture and urban planning



Living Shrines of Uyghur China

Lisa Ross is a Brooklyn-born photographer and video artist who has exhibited, lectured, and taught for almost 20 years. Her work has been shown in Europe and the United States, including at the Rubin Museum; the University of California, Berkeley; and Les Rencontres d'Arles in France.

Lisa Ross's ethereal photographs were created over the course of a decade on journeys to remote parts of the Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region in Western China. These monumental images show shrines created during pilgrimages to Islamic holy sites that have existed for centuries. The markers, often for a Sufi saint, are adorned with offerings for a prayer or a wish. Ross's images are a portrait of the landscape in which collective memory and faith endure forces of nature. Their simplicity and austerity invoke ideas of spirituality, eternity, and transcendence.

Accessibility for outsiders is difficult to navigate, but Ross worked closely with a local scholar and historian whose essays contextualize the photographs. As rapid modernization could soon jeopardize some of these places and traditions, Ross's rare images are valuable not only for their intrinsic beauty, but also as an important record of a rich and vibrant culture.


Weisman, on the other hand, provides calm visual pauses and clean lines as a foil to the showcase pieces to create balance and cohesion.



Léon Krier is an architect, teacher, and writer. He has taught at the Royal College of Arts in London, Princeton University, Yale University, and other institutions. In 2003 he was awarded the inaugural Driehaus prize for Classical and Traditional Architecture.

First published in 1985 to an acute and critical reception, *Albert Speer: Architecture 1932–1942* is a lucid, wide-ranging study of an important neoclassical architect. Yet it is simultaneously much more: a philosophical rumination on art and politics, good and evil.

Author Léon Krier answers the question "Can a war criminal be a great artist?" affirmatively, showing that Albert Speer, Adolf Hitler's architect of choice, is responsible for one of the boldest architectural and urban oeuvres of modern times. Krier bases his study on a series of interviews with Speer. The projects presented center on Speer's city plan for Berlin as well as major institutions including the Great Hall, Hitler's Palace, the High Command of the Armed Forces, the New Chancellery, and the Triumphal Arch.

In this facsimile of the 1985 edition, Krier candidly confronts the great difficulty of disentangling the architecture and urbanism of Albert Speer from its political intentions, and so makes an important contribution to the study of classicism in architecture and architecture in affairs of state.
